## MAHOGANY BAY TAKES ON AUTO STUDENT

Mahogany Bay Vintage Boats, located in Mound, Minn., specializes in vintage watercraft from days long ago. Yet Todd Warner and Dave Bortner did something rather odd this summer – they hired a student majoring in automotive restoration technology to work at Mahogany Bay as an intern. "I thought he'd be a great candidate for our mechanical department based on his internship at the Mercedes Classic Center and his education at McPherson," explains Dave.

"I called McPherson and asked about Nick. I contacted him, we met, and he accepted the internship." Then one day, his dad said "Wouldn't it be fun to get a boat?" That first boat was a 1955 Chris-Craft Capri, and soon after, Dave started a boat business to finance college.

Dave met Todd Warner, founder and Chairman of Mahogany Bay, back in 1977. Actually, Dave and his dad, and Todd and his father, had all been gathering boats around the country and would pass each other on the way to getting a boat or dropping one off.
